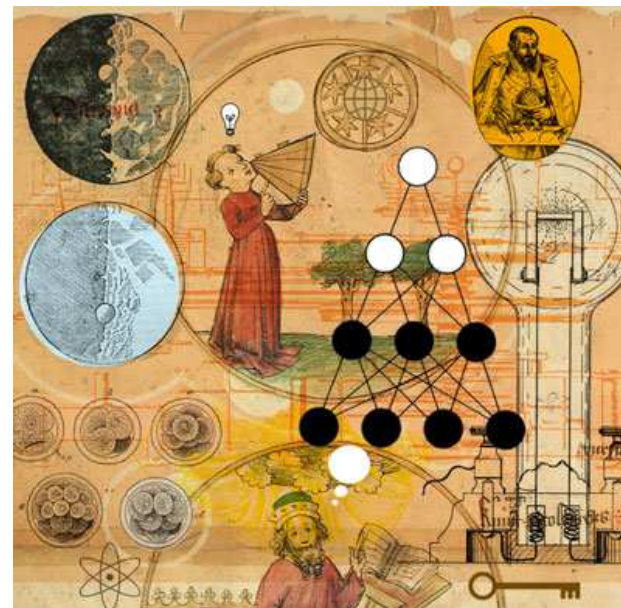


The history of the International Intersivision Groups in ANSE


